Mary Hall Freedom Village is located in Sandy Springs, Georgia. The building is clearly visible directly off of Peachtree Dunwoody Road which is a very busy 4 lane highway with heavy transportation. There were women gathered outside the building while I drove by. It looks to be a well cared for building with plenty of room for parking which is accessed only through a secured gate. There is a shopping center within ½ a mile as well as a Publix grocery store. This is a business area for business and not residential.



Mary Hall Freedom Village works mainly with people of any age. They are in recovery from an addiction, nearing homelessness, pregnant, IV drug users, and whose children are in need of support as well. According to County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, Fulton county ranks 27th in overall health factors in overall health outcomes.

Aggregate (Target) Population

- Women and children who are vulnerable populations; fleeing domestic violence or sex trafficking.

- Female veterans with PTSD

- Homeless women and children under age of 13

- The population is composed of Black, White, Hispanic and Asian women and children



The institution seeks to empower women and children who qualify to be their clients in ending the generational cycles of poverty, addiction, and homelessness.

More than 800 women, children, veterans, and families directly benefit from services of Mary Hall Freedom House each year.

Since 1996, the institution has empowered more than 10,000 women, children, veterans, and families (Mary Hall Freedom House Inc., n.d.)
