Today's client assignment are Crystal Ross and Paul Hite.

Crystal Ross is a 45-year-old female presenting to Chamberlain Clinic with nausea, diarrhea, and chills for the past 24 hours. She has a history of left breast cancer and left upper extremity lymphedema. She currently receives chemotherapy treatments every four weeks.

Paul Hite is a 42-year-old male presenting to the clinic as a new patient with complaints of lower back pain.

You asked 58 unique questions. 29 were key questions/statements suggested by the case author. You also asked an additional 29 unique questions.

✗ Missed Questions

You didn't ask all important questions suggested by the case author for this case. You missed asking 19 of the 48 key questions. (Note: Sometimes there is more than one way to get similar information from your patient. Eliciting information in more than one way when interviewing a patient can be useful.)

Introductory:

- Can I take a look at your wristband to confirm your identity?

Associated Sx/Sx Characteristics:

- Have you been having fevers?
- Do you have pain/discomfort when you urinate?
- What treatments have you had for your diarrhea?
- What treatments have you had for your fever?
- When was your last bowel movement?
- Does your fever come and go?
- Do you have any pain or other symptoms associated with your diarrhea?
- How high is your fever?
- Do you have any other symptoms or concerns we should discuss?
- Are your swollen glands painful, tender, hard, or draining?
- Does anything make your diarrhea better or worse?
- Have you had diarrhea like this before?
- When did your diarrhea start?
- When did your fever start?

Risk Factors:

PMH:

- Have you had any surgeries in your life?
- Have you been taking your medications as prescribed?

SH:

- Are you experiencing any violence, abuse, trauma, or bullying? If so, by whom?
