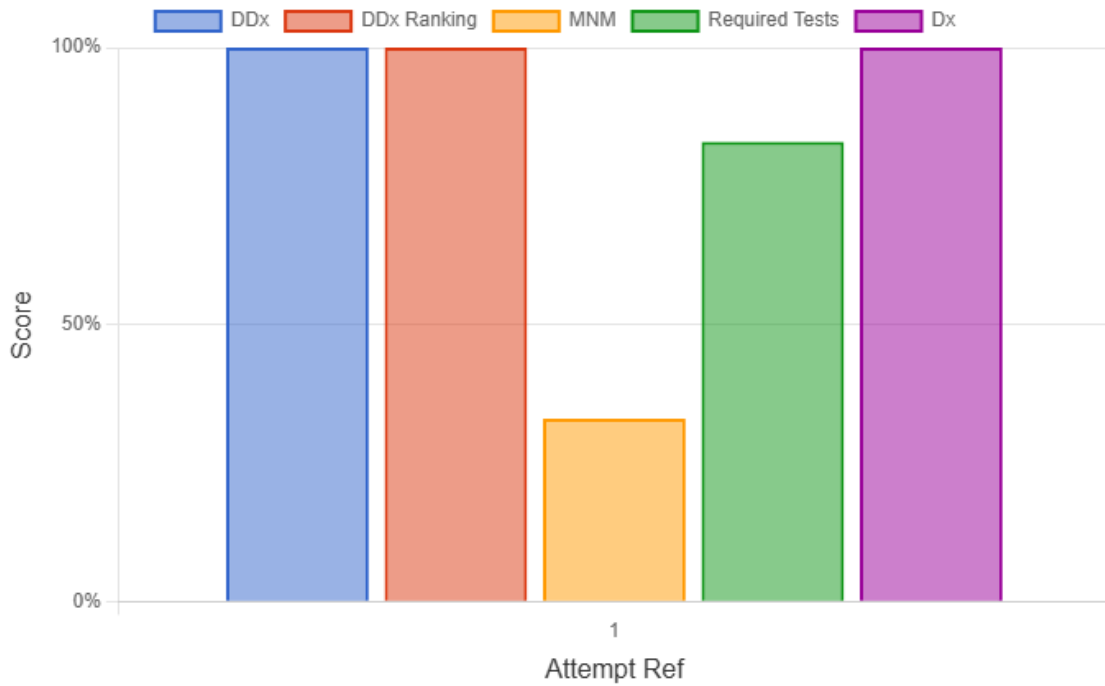

Chief Complaint: Blood Pressure Recheck

Problem Statement

Heather Nardone is a 56-year-old female presenting for a blood pressure recheck after a workplace health fair identified an elevated reading of 132/74 mmHg. She has a history of hypothyroidism and obesity, reports a sedentary lifestyle, a high-fat/high-salt diet, and a strong family history of cardiovascular disease. Subjectively, she denies chest pain, palpitations, dyspnea, syncope, dizziness, leg swelling, polyuria, polydipsia, or heat/cold intolerance. Objectively, today's blood pressure is 118/72 mmHg with a normal pulse and respiratory rate. Exam reveals obese body habitus, xanthelasma above the medial eyelids, and corneal arcus bilaterally. Cardiopulmonary, abdominal, neurologic, and skin exams are otherwise unremarkable with no murmurs, edema, rales, or neurologic deficits noted.

Differential Diagnosis

Hyperlipidemia(E78.5): Rational Strongly supported by LDL 190 on exam finding

Diabetes Mellitus Type 2(E11.9)

Hypertension, Primary(essential)(I10)

Acute Coronary Syndrome(I24.9)

Atrial Fibrillation or Flutter (I48)

Chronic Kidney Disease (N18.1)

Hypothyroidism(E03.9)

Nephrotic Syndrome (N04)

Peripheral Artery disease (I73.9)

Xanthoma (E75.5)

Differential Diagnosis Ranking

1. Hyperlipidemia(E78.5)-Lead MNM
2. Diabetes Mellitus Type 2(E11.9)-Alternative MNM
3. Hypertension, Primary(essential)(I10)-Alternative
